TOPIC – (Grammar) Ch 1 Alphabetical Order

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

The lesson aims to teach children about organizing words in **alphabetically** correct order.

OBJECTIVES:

I- Specific Objectives-

To enable the students to -

SP1- arrange the given words in an alphabetical order. (U)

SP2 – use a dictionary easily to find the meanings of words. (U)

SP3 – organizing data, such as lists of names or addresses. (U)

SP4 - set a foundation for alphabetizing words and organizing information more efficiently. **(K)**

SP5- improve vocabulary and language skills. (**K**) (**KPI 1**)

II- Behavioural Objectives

To enable the students to-

B1 - help understand the concept of sequence and order. (K)

B 2 - enhances observation and spatial skills. (K)

PROCESS/ACTIVITIES -

ACT 1 - Introduction and explanation of the concept (board, flashcards) (**KPI 1**)

ACT 2 - Put word cards in front of the child and ask them to arrange them in alphabetical order. (flash cards, board) (**KPI 1**)

ACT 3- Form groups of 4-5 students and allot categories to them.(e.g. fruits, flowers etc.) The students then give a name to each member and arrange themselves according to the **alphabetical order. (KPI 1**)
