Lesson Plan 3 Class – VIII Subject – English

Chapter – The Hound of Baskerville

Brief Description – This story is written by Sir Arthur Conan Doyle that creates an ambience of fear and suspense heightened by the intervention of the supernatural through belief in a curse on the Baskerville.
