# Lesson Plan 3 <br> Class - VIII Subject - English 

## Chapter - The Hound of Baskerville

Brief Description - This story is written by Sir Arthur Conan Doyle that creates an ambience of fear and suspense heightened by the intervention of the supernatural through belief in a curse on the Baskerville.
