

Lesson Plan
Class - VII Subject – English
Literature:Poem-Missed

Brief Description: This is a poem from the famous humorist, P G Wodehouse. The poet describes the beautiful setting of the poem—a cricket ground, and suddenly realises that he missed a catch. He goes on to speak of the causes for his distraction. He then describes the premature rejoicing of his team-mates before he bungled the catch. Then it was his opponents’ turn to rejoice while he is devastated and resolves to never play cricket again
