Subject- HISTORY

Chapter 5 – Nomadic Empires

Brief Description – Chapter deals with the rise of Mongol Empire across China, Russia, Western Asia and Eastern Europe. Mongol polity, economy and bureaucracy was a force to be reckon with post twelfth century onwards and left a lasting imprint on the world history.

Objective: By the end of this lesson, students should be able to understand the key features and significance of the Mongol Empire in the World and apply their knowledge to analyze historical events.

- **Remembering:** Recall key events and figures of the Mongol Empire. Ex Genghis Khan and his sons, Yam courier system.
- **Understanding:** Comprehend the social, cultural, and political aspects of the Mongol Empire.
- **Applying:** Analyze the impact of Mongol rule on Asian and European society.
- **Analyzing:** Examine the factors that contributed to the rise and fall of the Mongol Empire.
- **Evaluating:** Assess the significance of the Mongol Empire in the context of world history.
- **Creating:** Construct arguments regarding the Mongol Empire's influence on modern World.

Materials:

- NCERT History textbook
- Whiteboard and markers
- Visual aids (maps, images, timelines)
- Handouts or digital resources

Procedure:

1. **Introduction (5 minutes):**

- Begin with a question: "Have you ever wondered about the great empires that ruled World in the past?"
- Share the learning objectives and explain that today's lesson will focus on the Mongol Empire.

2. **Remembering (5 minutes):**

- Recap the previous lesson or prior knowledge about the Mongol Empire.
- Discuss key figures and dates associated with the Mongols.

3. **Understanding (5 minutes):**

- Use visual aids to show maps and images of the Mongol Empire.

- Divide the class into small groups and assign each group a debate topic related to the Mongol Empire's significance.
- Give them a few minutes to prepare arguments.

8. **Debate (5 minutes):**

- Allow each group to present their arguments and encourage critical thinking and counterarguments.

9. **Conclusion (5 minutes):**

- Summarize the key points of the lesson.
- Encourage questions and further discussion.
- Assign homework or reading from the textbook to reinforce the concepts learned.

Assessment: Assessment can be based on class participation, the quality of arguments presented during the debate, and homework assignments.

Homework: Read the NCERT textbook's chapter on the Mongol Empire and answer the provided questions for deeper understanding.
